The Center for Medical Technology Policy (CMTP) is seeking a Senior Research Director to plan, monitor and coordinate projects that identify specific questions health care decision makers have about selected medical technologies, and determine the study methods that will be needed to address these questions with an emphasis on real-world, pragmatic clinical designs. The work bridges the scientific and policy arenas, requiring technical knowledge of retrospective and prospective study design as well as knowledge of the policy context for comparative effectiveness research. The Senior Research Director will work closely with multi-stakeholder groups, comprised of public and private payers, manufacturers, patients, clinicians, and methodologists, to frame the study design and develop feasible solutions for conducting the research. They will conduct their own research to support the development of these solutions, but also be responsible for leading a team of junior staff and contractors to complete the work. The focus is on prospective, clinical research, rather than retrospective analyses or systematic reviews. The Senior Research Director reports to the Vice President of Programs, and will participate with the Founding Director and Vice President, Programs to identify new sources of funding for CMTP.

*Qualifications for the Position*

- A Ph.D., MD, or Master's degree in epidemiology, economics, public policy, or other related discipline.
- Professional experience and background in health services research.
- Ability to conceptualize, organize, and implement complex multi-year research studies
- Skill in analyzing issues and developing/presenting facts and recommendations or solutions in clear, concise, and logical terms, both orally and in writing.
- Six or more years experience managing projects and junior research staff.
- Experience interacting professionally with diverse individuals and organizations, including senior government and policy officials, and senior leadership from health care organizations.
- Demonstrated record of peer-reviewed publications and presentations at national meetings.
- Track record in obtaining government sponsored research funding from such clients as AHRQ and CMS preferred.

Salary range is \$100,000 - \$150,000, commensurate with qualifications and experience. Must be willing to work in Baltimore.
